Lana Richardson Celebrates 25 Years as Arc NW Staff

For Lana Richardson, working with children who have disabilities is more than a job, it's a calling. She recalls being 12 years old and observing a group of kids her age at school who were learning in their own classroom. Lana was immediately drawn to these youth with disabilities and knew she wanted to be part of making a difference in their lives.

Early in her career Lana worked in daycare centers and preschools and readily demonstrated her gift for connecting with children who have learning differences. Her passion became working one-on-one with children who needed extra support and understanding.

On February 1, 1994 Lana began working with the

Latchkey program through The Arc NW at the urging of her niece. After three years she became the Director. During this time, she worked in the Community Participation Program for individuals 26 years and older, helping them to be included in community activities. She also worked at The Arc NW summer camp for teens and young adults.

All this experience was a springboard to Lana's dream job of being the Lekotek Leader at The Arc NW which she began in 2000. Lekotek is a national program that provides monthly play sessions and a toy lending library for children with disabilities ages 12 and under. Lana's duties include leading play experiences with children and their caregivers, providing play to school groups, giving presentations to parent groups, and supervising the Toy Librarian.

Lana finds that child-directed play is important for self-discovery, socialization, and helping parents learn how to interact with their child. She understands toys as "children's tools for learning" and the play sessions a welcome departure from therapy and the structure of school. "Play is the cornerstone for being part of the community," Lana says. She is providing a gateway for a future of successful inclusion and employment.

When asked what she loves most about her job Lana says, "I love watching the kids grow, supporting families, and being an advocate for them. I've grown a lot too." Lana exudes patience and a gentle presence which immediately attracts kids of all ages. Children who come to The Arc in a grumpy mood immediately brighten with smiles and hugs when they see Ms. Lana! One of the most rewarding things for Lana has been watching these kids grow into adulthood over her 25 years with The Arc NW.

Lana has seen a lot of changes in programs and staff at the Arc NW but remarks how blessed she feels to share in this important mission with such an excellent team. She hopes that The Arc NW will continue to expand and reach more people who need services. Over the last few decades society has come a long way with including individuals with disabilities and not using hurtful labels. She hopes that job opportunities will increase and those with disabilities will be even more integral in community life.

Lana has given so much to The Arc NW, and to families over these past 25 years. We cannot thank her enough for her dedication, her faithful commitment and her huge heart. We congratulate her on this milestone and thank her for blessing all of us with the special person that she is!


