From The Director

Budgets, Benefits, and Backing....Oh My!

The proposed US federal budget for 2020 includes significant cuts to Medicaid, the insurance providing access to health care and communitybased services for people with disabilities. "If passed by Congress



[this] would put the lives of people with disabilities at risk," says The Arc USA. "If enacted, states would receive less federal support to administer Medicaid, resulting in restricting eligibility, cuts to services, and growing waiting lists." The budget proposal also includes strict work requirements for those receiving Medicaid, which may be impossible for people with disabilities and those with complex health needs. This could mean a loss of insurance and services for people who depend on Medicaid to live self-determined lives. (https://blog.thearc.org)

Governor Gretchen Whitmer's proposed state budget 2020-2021 for Michigan includes an increase in state funding for special education. The state administration put forth a weighted funding system that takes into account the higher cost of educating students with special needs. The current state reimbursement rate for schools for each student in special education is \$4,875.00. Whitmer proposes an increase of \$2,571.00 for a new payment rate of \$7,446.00 per student. This budget will also increase funding for economically at-risk students and for career and technical training. (State Budget Office, Chris Kolb State Budget Director)

We still live in a world where there is VERY inconsistent support for people with disabilities to have full inclusion and to live self-determined lives. The Arc's advocacy in local communities, as well as at the state and national levels, is critical for ensuring full inclusion. Let's never give up the fight for backing what creates a great life for everyone.
