From The Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Happy New Year! 2020 already brings us the opportunity to advocate for good benefits for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Robert Gordon, the Director of the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), wrote a letter on January 7, 2020 proposing changes to the Medicaid system. The proposal is for a Specialty Integrated Health Model (SIP). Some brief highlights of this are:

- Preserving community mental health services.
- Specialty Integrated Health Model (SIP) that would mean one payer and one accountable. organization – a specialty integrated plan or a traditional Medicaid plan – for every person.
- Choices of SIP plans.
- Possible statewide SIP model.
- Call for a statewide public led SIP.
- Focus on specialty populations, one of with is individuals with disabilities.

This is a VERY brief outline so please go to Michigan.gov/FutureOfBehavioralHealth for more information.

The Arc of Michigan is hard at work with advocacy efforts around this proposal due to several concerns including:

- There is no explanation of how the plan works or how the parts work together.
- The only obvious principle throughout the plan is the state ridding itself of financial risk.
- The plan has none of our values, including person-centered planning and self-determination.
- It does not address current disparities from one place to another or enforcement of current contract provisions.
- The plan says nothing about supports or services or rights and appeals, those things that are the most important to those served.

Lekotek Continues to Grow


